

## **Apple Nachos**

#### Ingredients:

- ¼ cup peanut butter
- 1/4 cup non-fat Greek yogurt
- · 2 tablespoons milk
- · 1 tablespoon honey
- 2 red apples, cored and cut into 1/4 inch slices
- 2 green apples, cored and cut into 1/4 inch slices



### **Exploring Careers With 4-H**



**Aviation Careers-** On October 7 from 1:00-4:00 PM. Youth currently in grades 7-9 can learn from Midwest Aviation Services what avionics and maintenance are required for a plane. Also learn from the National Weather Service Paducah Location Forecasters and how they interact with aviation. This program will be hosted at the Midwest Aviation Services and National Weather Services.

**Legal Careers**- on October 8th (9:00 AM-3:00 PM) and October 9th (9:00 AM-12:00 PM). Youth grades 6-11 will learn how a court case is processed through the system. Assistant Commonwealth Nick Jones and Judge James Mills will lead them. The youth will be able to become a courtroom member on the second day with a mock court case.

**Resume And Interview Skills-** On October 9 from 1:00-3:00 PM. Youth in grades 6-8 can learn from Mary Ann Medlock with the West Kentucky Workforce Board to explore future jobs, build resumes, participate in mock interviews and prepare for their first day of work.

**Military Careers-** On October 10 from 9:00 AM -3:00 PM. Youth in grades 9-12 can meet with military recruiters to learn about each branch. Participants will be able to learn about careers within the military and the benefits of joining. Lunch will be provided.

**Law Enforcement-** On October 11 from 12:00-4:00 PM. Youth in grades 6-10 will become a Jr. Detective for the afternoon and solve a mock crime scene. Paducah Police Department will lead the case.

The McCracken County Fair saw an impressive turnout from 4-H youth this year, with approximately 157 young participants entering a wide variety of projects in the 4-H Youth Division. These entries showcased the creativity, dedication, and hard work of our local youth. The total premium payout for the division reached \$1,880, rewarding the efforts of these talented individuals.

This year, we had 47 Grand Champion winners at the county level, an achievement that highlights the exceptional quality of the projects submitted. These champions then had the exciting opportunity to have their work judged and displayed at the Kentucky State Fair in Louisville. At the state level, McCracken County continued to shine, with 15 youth winning across 25 entries. Lincoln A. proudly earned a Grand Champion title for his cartoon drawing.

The 4-H youth who participated in the fair demonstrated a strong commitment to excellence, and we are proud to celebrate their accomplishments. Congratulations to all the participants and thank you to everyone who supported these youth throughout the fair season!
